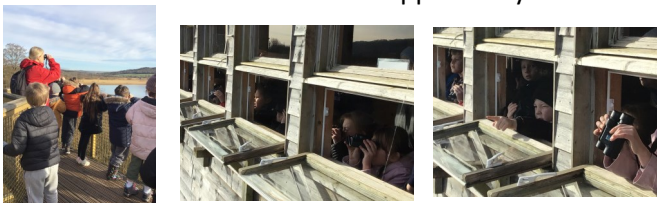
ATTENDANCE

RYELANDS UNIVERSITY

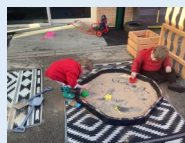

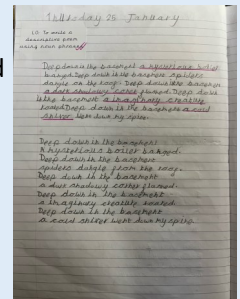
Year 1

Stay & Read - Thank you to all the parents who are attending stay and read sessions on a Friday! Stay and Read is such an important part of your child's development. Sharing a love of reading with your child can build a lifetime love of reading which is so important for your child's future. If you haven't popped down yet, please try and attend one of the sessions to share a story with your child.

Life Skills - This half term Year 1 have been increasing their walking stamina week by week. We are currently up to walking for a full 45 minutes! We have loved our walks each week and finished the half term off with a fab trip to Barley Cop Woods!

Year 3

In year 3, we have been reading "The thing in the Basement" and have used this to write our own Poems and Mystery Stories.



Our topic has been forces and magnets. We have looked at the different types of forces including contact forces and non-contact forces and then used our knowledge of forces to make a peg monster and a toy that moves using levers. We have used the non-contact forces in our art lessons by doing pendulum painting and spin painting. We really enjoyed painting this way. We then focused on magnets as a non-contact force and have been finding out how magnets work and what they are attracted to which we then used to help us to make a game using magnetic materials.

Year 4

Year 4 have been focusing on their descriptive skills for persuasive writing. Here are snippets of their writing about their school Ryelands.
