What we have been learning

Year 1 - In autumn term 1 our topic has been 'Lost in the Toy Museum'. This was a history based topic focusing on toys from the past. Children have been exploring how toys have changed through the decades, what they were made from and how they were used.

During this topic, we looked at the book 'Lost in the Toy Museum' and followed Bunting the cat on his epic journey through the toy museum to find his friends. We have been writing short stories about the book and we have also been testing materials to make a waterproof jacket for Bunting!

Year 3 - The Stone Age to Iron Age

We started our first term in Year 3 by taking on the role of archaeologists, digging for artefacts to find out about life in pre-history. We have excavated coprolites (Stone Age poo!) to find out what they ate. We made cave drawings and cooked Iron Age food on an open fire. We discovered how life evolved over thousands of years.

Year 5 - got stuck into their science topic: properties and changes of materials. They have tested different materials and conducted experiments to learn about reversible and irreversible changes.

In English, we studied the book 'Coraline' - a spooky tale which inspired us to write our own spooky stories!

EXTRA CURRICULAR CLUBS

We have had a lot of extra curricular clubs running after school for the children this half term including Dance Club, Musical Theatre, Eco Club, Chess Club and The Sustainables. The Sustainables Club have been planting spring bulbs in the meadow. The Dance Club are getting ready for the dance show "Dance through the Decades" to celebrate 60 years of Our Ladys, the children have picked to do a mash up of songs from the years they were born. Musical Theatre are busy preparing for the upcoming events. They have been asked to perform at John Kay Court and for the North West Air Ambulance in December.

BIKEABILITY

Over the last two weeks Year 5 have spent two days each, learning about road safety and looking after their bikes. They have all thoroughly enjoyed this and have all passed with flying colours. It can not be overstated how important this training has been for them.

The children then practised developing their fine motor skills by using glue spreaders to spread glue onto the leaves and then stick the small collage pieces onto the leaves.
