# OUR PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT

## As a school we are expected to:

- ✓ Provide a happy, safe and welcoming environment for children, parents, staff, governors, and the wider community. We will actively nurture partnerships with everyone.
- ✓ Provide a broad and balanced curriculum, encouraging all children to realise their full potential.
- ✓ Have high expectations of individual achievement in school activities and positively promote and expect good behaviour.
- ✓ Promote good communication between school and home, keeping you informed about school activities through messages, letters and newsletters on the app, notice boards, the school website.
- ✓ Offer support and guidance through regular workshops that link to your child's learning and well-being.
- ✓ Provide an annual written report on your child's progress and provide regular opportunities during the year to discuss your child's work and personal development.
- ✓ Provide homework every week and check that it has been completed.
- ✓ Listen to and act upon parent and pupil concerns.
- ✓ Make regular surveys of parent opinion on the work of the school.

## As a pupil I am expected to:

- ✓ Know and follow the 3 school rules:

Respect

Ready to learn

Responsible and safe

Be able to talk about what these rules 'look like' in different situations.

- ✓ Read to an adult or share a book at home every day.
- ✓ Read every day and complete my homework on time each week.
- ✓ Work hard, try my best and be proud of my achievements.
- ✓ Ask for help or support if I am unsure of something or worried.
- ✓ Keep myself safe on the internet.
- ✓ Be in school every day and on time during term time.
- ✓ Be prepared for school, in correct school uniform, with everything I need.

## **As a parent/carer I am expected to:**

- ✓ Treat all staff with respect.
- ✓ Ensure my child is in school on time every day during term time, unless they are too unwell to attend. If this is the case, tell the school by ringing or sending a message.
- ✓ Support and encourage my child to be fully involved in life at Ryelands Primary and Nursery School.
- ✓ Support the school's code of conduct for behaviour.
- ✓ Talk to a member of staff if I have any change in circumstances, concerns or problems that may affect my child's work or behaviour.
- ✓ Talk to someone in school if I have a concern about something such as a decision the school has made and follow the appropriate channels to seek to resolve this.
- ✓ Hear my child read, share a book or oversee their reading every day and add comments to their reading record.
- ✓ Ensure my child wears correct school uniform, brings a PE kit for sport in school and has the necessary equipment for lessons.
- ✓ If my child has a packed lunch, ensure that it is balanced and healthy food.
- ✓ Provide time and opportunity for my child to complete their homework.
- ✓ Support my child in using the internet safely at home.
- ✓ Attend parent's meetings to discuss my child's learning and progress. When this is not possible I will contact school to arrange a meeting at another time.
